The biggest news to hit Gibson County in decades was announced Monday morning, Tyson Foods will build a new plant at the Gibson County Industrial Park on the northern side of Humboldt and bring over 1,500 jobs to the area.

Approximately 250 guests and dignitaries attended the announcement held in the Humholdt Medical Center's conference room.

"This is a historic day for Humboldt and Gibson County," Humboldt Mayor Marvin Sikes said during the announcement. "Tyson Foods' tremendous capital investment and job creation will have a long lasting, positive impact in our community for years to come. 1 could not be more excited, and I want to thank Tyson Foods for their commitment to our city and county."
